A BILL

To make amounts provided under the Operation Safe Home and New Approach Anti-Drug programs available for use for providing law enforcement officers to patrol and provide security for housing assisted by the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “HUD Housing Secu-
5 rity and Flexibility Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. USE OF OPERATION SAFE HOME AND SAFE NEIGH-**
2 **BORHOOD GRANT AMOUNTS.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
4 sion of law, any field office of the Department of Housing
5 and Urban Development that receives or administers
6 grants amounts under the Operation Safe Home program
7 of the Office of the Inspector General of the Department
8 of Housing and Urban Development or under the New Ap-
9 proach Anti-Drug program of such Department may use
10 such amounts to enter into contracts, having terms of not
11 more than 3 years, with law enforcement officers or agen-
12 cies described in subsection (b) to provide security, pa-
13 trols, or other protective services for housing that is owned
14 or held by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Develop-
15 ment, or is assisted under a program of the Department
16 of Housing and Urban Development, and is within the ju-
17 risdiction or purview of such field office.

18 (b) LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AND AGEN-
19 CIES.—A law enforcement officer or agency described in
20 this subsection is a law enforcement officer that is author-
21 ized, under Federal or State law, to make arrests, or a
22 public agency whose officers have such authority.
