

Section 1602 - Quarterly Progress Report

Under Section 1602 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Tax Act of 2009 (Section 1602), state housing credit agencies are eligible to receive Section 1602 Payments to States for Low-Income Housing Projects in Lieu of Low-Income Housing Credit Allocation for 2009. The state housing credit agency uses the funds to make subawards. The Section 1602 program temporarily fills the gap left by a diminished demand for low-income housing tax credits. Payments result in the creation and retention of jobs and in an increase in the affordable housing supply.

The Recovery Act encourages accountability and transparency in the use of funds. This quarterly progress report is in response; it is required under the Grant Terms and Conditions, item 8. To complete the quarterly progress report, information for each subaward and submit the report to 1602Reports@do.treas.gov within 10 working days after the end of each quarter. The report is cumulative; add information at the end of the form each quarter. Quarters end on March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31.
