



## The Ohio Historic Preservation Tax Credit Pipeline Initiative

Provides small grants and technical assistance to assist in nominating buildings and districts to the National Register of Historic Places. Creates a pipeline of properties that are eligible for redevelopment assistance through the Ohio Historic Preservation Tax Credit program. Helps communities and property owners advance redevelopment of underutilized historic buildings.

### Eligible Applicants

Property owners, local governments, civic organizations and other related entities are eligible to apply. Depending on the project type, documented support of the building owner(s) may be required.

### Potential Funding

Four project types are eligible for funding:

- Type A: Nomination for Individual Building (\$4,000)
- Type B: Nomination of a Historic District (\$12,000)
- Type C: Integrity Investigation of a Building (\$12,000)
- Type D: Multiple Property Planning (\$8,000)

The application document provides guidance on the specific activities permitted and requirements of each project type. Funds will be disbursed by the State Historic Preservation Office of the Ohio History Connection and can be used toward documented third-party expenses; no recipient staff costs will be reimbursed.

### Program Requirements

Funding will be approved for projects on a first come, first served basis. Applicants will be required to submit a National Register Preliminary Questionnaire to the State Historic Preservation Office to receive a recommendation that properties have potential to qualify for the National Register and/or the grant project is a recommended tool.

### Timeline for Application

Applications are accepted on an open cycle until funds are allocated each fiscal year.
