



Locating your Development Site's Census Tract Numbers

The 2012 Draft Qualified Allocation Plan (QAP) includes a variety of eligibility, 30% boost, and selection criteria based on concentration and other data for the census tract, place, and/or county in which a proposed development is to be located. In order to provide more certainty and transparency in the application review and scoring process, each year the Department releases a summary of the data that will be used by the Department. While this data is currently being compiled, locating a development site's census tract number is one step in determining how a site will be considered under the rules. Below are instructions to locate your site's census tract numbers.

Instructions are provided for determining the 2000 census tract number and 2010 census tract number. As a result of the recent release of the 2010 decennial census information, some sites may need to determine both a 2000 census tract number and 2010 census tract number. This should only be necessary in a limited number of cases as the majority of census tracts remain unchanged.

Please be aware the 2012 QAP has not been finalized and the final approved QAP may differ from the currently approved draft.

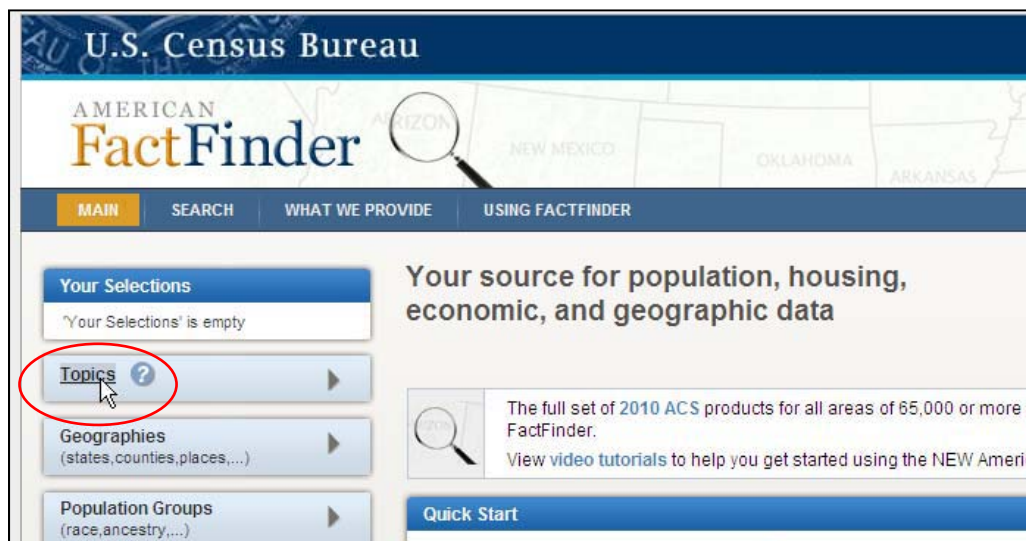
2010 Census Tract Number

- 1.) Go to: <http://factfinder2.census.gov>
- 2.) On the right hand side of the screen, click on the link in the “Address Search” box, which will take you to the address look up screen. See the screen shot below:




2000 Census Tract Number

- 1.) From the main FactFinder page: <http://factfinder2.census.gov>, click on the “Topics” link.



2.) Once on the Topics screen, select the “Year” link:





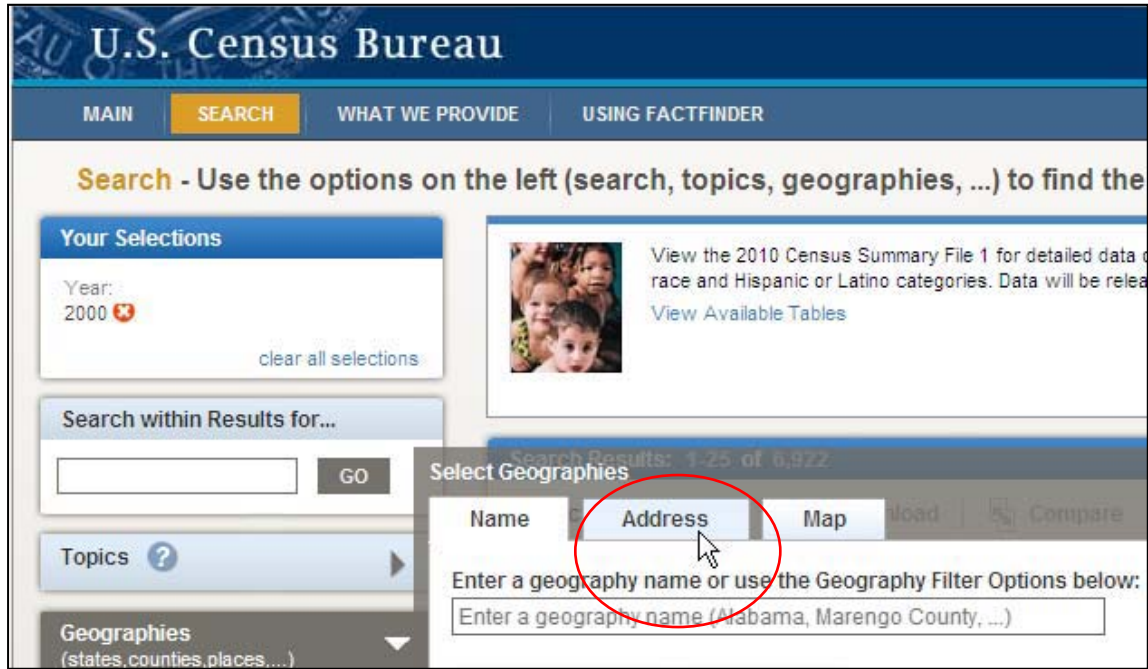

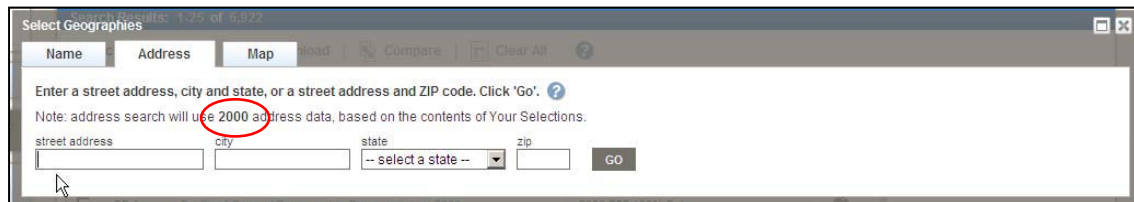
